



# EMERGENCY RESPONSE

## Anhydrous Ammonia Exposure

Post in all areas where ammonia is present.

### IF YOU DETECT AMMONIA ODOR OR SEE AN EXPOSURE: ACT IMMEDIATELY

#### STEP 1

##### **SOUND THE ALARM**

Activate the nearest emergency alarm or notify a supervisor immediately. Do not investigate the source alone.

#### STEP 2

##### **EVACUATE THE AREA**

Move all personnel upwind and away from the affected area. Assemble at the designated assembly point.

#### STEP 3

##### **CALL FOR HELP**

Call emergency services (911) if anyone has been exposed or the release cannot be controlled immediately.

#### STEP 4

##### **TREAT EXPOSED PERSONS**

Move to fresh air. Flush eyes with water for 15+ minutes. Flush skin with large amounts of water. Remove contaminated clothing.

#### STEP 5

##### **SEEK MEDICAL ATTENTION**

All exposed persons must be evaluated by a physician even if symptoms seem minor. Symptoms can worsen 18-24 hours later.

#### **KEY FACTS**

Colorless gas, strong odor. Noticeable 5-50 ppm. Serious effects above 100 ppm. Not known to cause cancer.
