Forklift and Pedestrian Safety

A forklift weighs as much as a dump truck. Stay alert.

Never get closer than 2 feet to any moving vehicle. This is the 2-Foot Rule.

Most forklift-pedestrian incidents happen because one party was not seen.

01

The 2-Foot Rule

Never approach within 2 feet of a vehicle that is operating, even if parked.

Wait for the operator to fully shut down before approaching any vehicle.

02

Pedestrian Rules

Look both ways before entering a vehicle aisle. Stay alert at all times.

Keep aisles clear of obstacles. Do not operate a vehicle without authorization.

03

Driver Responsibilities

Complete your pre-operational checklist before every use.

Drive slowly. Stop and sound your horn at all blind corners and stop signs.

04

General Safety Rules

Always wear a seatbelt when operating a vehicle equipped with one.

Maintain 3 points of contact when entering and exiting the vehicle.

FORKLIFT / PEDESTRIAN SAFETY CHECK

Review before every shift in vehicle-shared areas.

- ☐ I will maintain the 2-foot rule around all vehicles
- ☐ I will look both ways before entering any vehicle aisle
- ☐ All aisles in my area are clear of obstacles
- ☐ I will not operate any vehicle I am not trained and authorized for
- ☐ Driver: pre-operational checklist completed before operating
- ☐ Driver: seatbelt fastened before moving the vehicle
- ☐ Driver: horn sounded at all blind corners and intersections
- ☐ Driver: vehicle completely shut down before conversations
